

2010 Orthopedic Update

January 11 - 15 Yellow Cedar Lodge, Terrace B.C.

Born from the needs assessment of a 2009 emergency medicine conference, the faculty invites you to a continuing medical education meeting delivering a broad based set of orthopedic topics commonly encountered by emergency and family medicine physicians.

This educational event is to be held from January 11 - 15, 2010 at the Yellow Cedar Lodge, in Terrace British Columbia (a two hour flight north of Vancouver). This academic retreat includes 16 hours of continuing medical education and a selection of optional winter experiences. Past participants have been impressed with the small group setting that provides opportunity for case sharing and engaging commentary.



It is well known that a huge percentage of family physician and emergency room visits are orthopedic in nature. The general objective of this course is to cover a variety of Orthopedic and Emergency Medicine topics commonly encountered by full/part time family, emergency and sport medicine physicians and to update them on the latest trends and current standards of practice. Through a didactic and case-based approach, this course will harness the unique skill sets of the orthopedic and emergency medicine specialists to review the “not-to-be-missed” injuries.

In addition the conference allows for the opportunity to interact with colleagues and for direct one-on-one learning from consultant orthopedic surgeons.

The curriculum is structured into four educational tracks, each led by a distinguished speaker specializing in that field. Those will include: shoulder injuries, knee and spine specifics and finally an Emergency Medicine update.

Course Director, Marty Bouliane MD FRCS (C)

Dr. Bouliane graduated medical school in 1994 and completed orthopedic residency in 1999 both at the U of Alberta.
